Introduction

Ethics is a science which deals with the principles of good and bad and the norms for deciding and acting according to them.

Ethics has its basis in the human morality and cannot be ordered_by laws and rules. Therefore the participant is in communication the one who forms the ethics. By respecting general values the participant involved in communication will always act ethically towards other participants.

Ethics is always beneficiary for all the participants. Here belongs also the respect of all human rights because in this way we do not cause injustice upon the communicational partner.

The ethical quality of intuitive decisions always depends on the level of personal moral development of the speaker because it enables a good judgement.

Ethical communication is of great importance for school's activity. We are aware of the fact, that not all participants in communication are equipped with communicational skills to the same degree. Therefore it is important to get acquainted with characteristics of good communication and ethics. Also, it is important to learn from each other and through professional training.

At work, in school, communication is the most frequent between teachers and pupils. Therefore, it is of utmost importance that a teacher is professionally qualified and mature for ethical communication. In that way we set pupils a good example. Furthermore, we inform and teach students about this topic through various activities at school.

Values help us to regulate the relationship with ourselves, others and the society. The ways of carrying out them indicate the personal endeavour of school workers, pupils and parents.

Values are the basis for cultural behaviour in school and various activities, rules and ways of problem and conflict solving. The ways of working with values need to be adjusted to the age of pupils. Values need to be introduced to real-life situations.

In order to communicate effectively the following principles of good cooperation in school should be followed:

Mutual respect, honesty and justice
Active cooperation and patience
Respect personalities of all the communication partners
Regard of individual differences
Interests and needs of communication partners
The unity of acting
Active inclusion of all communication partners
Positive attitude, avoiding quarrelsome situations
Keeping smile
Avoid judgments and prejudice
Thinking about the consequences of your words and deeds

Being on time and exposing your thoughts in a clearly defined way

Ethical communication leads to: forming of good interpersonal relationships, solidarity and care of communication partners, respect of diversity, development of moral values, acceptance of responsibility for our behaviour, valuing our own behaviour and behaviour of others, satisfaction and effectiveness.

In order to communicate in ethical way it is also important the equality of communication partners. In the educational process it is of utmost importance for the teachers and other workers at school to respect the personality and individuality of students and also their religious beliefs, human dignity and the right to privacy.






Ethics in communication among project partners

- ✓ partnership is clear and open communication based on mutual respect, understanding, and information sharing.
- ✓ Teach and learn from each other.
- ✓ Work in a collaborative manner with colleagues at school and project partners
- ✓ Be sensitive to the need for confidentiality where appropriate;
- ✓ Base your relationship with partners on mutual trust and respect
- ✓ Avoid starting, spreading, or discussing gossip and hearsay about partners
- ✓ Avoid being critical of your partners
- √ don't be afraid to ask questions or to ask for help
- ✓ If you intend to make promises, you had better be prepared to keep them, no matter what the cost
- ✓ Do not get into arguments. Discuss things with partners rather than argue

- ✓ If you don't agree with something, think your response through and don't be argumentative or judgmental in what you say.
- ✓ Before you tease or joke with a person, make sure you know how they are going to take it. Everyone is different in this aspect. Take into account another person's feelings before you poke fun.
- ✓ Collaboration is vitally essential among partners
- ✓ When others are joyful, rejoice with them; when troubled or in mourning, be sympathetic. Make sure each person around you knows that you value them and know that they are important.
- ✓ If you have a brilliant idea that you know works well with partners then share it with those around you.
- ✓ Make sure each person around you knows that you value them and know that they are important.


Ethic in communication among teachers and parents



The biggest communication problem is we do not listen to understand. We listen to reply.

- •Think before you speak start with positive and then speak about the problem
- Listen before jumping into conclusion
- •Teachers need to explain the strengths and weaknesses of their students so that parents will understand the message and be receptive rather than defensive. This is especially important when the teacher conveys a difficult message about the student's misbehavior or learning problems. The message must be delivered clearly and with tact.


- •The best way to avoid misunderstandings with parents is to have ongoing, clear lines of communication from the beginning. The more you keep them informed about classroom news and include them in school happenings, the more they'll feel like a part of the team.
- •Begin the school-year by explaining how and when you'll keep in touch with parents. Let parents know that you value their questions and concerns and would never minimize them by responding "off the cuff" or "on the fly."
- •Always listen to parents carefully. Try not to interrupt think about how much you would dislike it yourself.
- Appreciate parents' critics and thank them.
- Personally meet as many parents as possible.





Chapter 3

Ethics in communication among students



Verbal part

Do

- •Tell the truth to build confidence
- •Address the partner by name
- •Customize the vocabulary to the partner
- Let her/hiim finish speaking
- •Be on top of things
- Accept substantial and constructive criticism
- Show empathy

Do not:

- Do not abuse
- Do not be vulgar
- •Do not take criticism personally
- Do not ironize
- •Do not provide information about other persons

Nonverbal part

Do:


- •Customize tone, volume and speed of speech to the situation and communication partner so that speech remains neutral and our communication partner gets no space for misinterpretation of the content
- •Respect the personal zone and personal space of the others
- •Monitor your posture not to stay in a defensive or offensive position
- •Consider the suitability of touching the communication partner(take into account age and relationship)
- •Care about your appearance and the environment in which the communication takes place

Do not:

- •Do not raise your voice and do not accelerate speech rate under emotional stress (if the communication partner makes you angry)
- Do not use abusive gestures
- •Do not enter the intimate zone of communication partner (less than 50 cm); if necessary, apperceive her/his reaction sensibly
- •Do not show impatience (watching the clock, twiddling with things)

"THE ROLE OF GOOD COMMUNICATION IN THE FAMILY LIFE AND HOW TO ACQUIRE IT"


